Saint-Suliac-sur-l'Ouvève Saint-Suliac-sur-l'Ouvève is a former commune in the Maine-et-Loire department in western France. On 15 January 2016, it was merged into the new commune of Saint-Suliac.

Geography Saint-Suliac-sur-l'Ouvève is located in a deep valley carved into the volcanic rock, forming a plateau of about 30 metres at an elevation of 150 metres, north of Sainte-Christine-sur-le-Mignon. It is surrounded by vineyards and by the buildings of the commune. The river Ouvève flows through the commune.

History The village appears on a 1236 herbarium.

Population Sights The village is known for its beehives, which produce about 400 kg of honey each year. The two church bell towers of the church have been classified since 1963 as a monument historique.

Notable people A number of people have held official posts in the area. Pierre Le Pair, "Cabinet of the Ministers of the realm", was born in the village on 25 December 1658. A commemorative plaque has been placed in the village to commemorate the occasion. It has also been the birthplace of: Pierre de Thouars, (1605-1676), soldier and author. He is thought to have written a number of books during his long stay in the French colonies, including the *Vie des expéditions galantes de M. de Thouars à l'Amérique et l'Asie*. While using the simple keygen application that came with the download, I was instructed on how to obtain the "xforce keygen", this worked perfectly. Since I use a Mac, I just downloaded the application and ran it from there. The application found the keygen for me and I was prompted to place my serial number. I submitted the serial number that came with the software and the keygen was activated, or whatever you call it. I used the software for a little while, then it told me it was time to use the "product crack". I thought of doing it, but then I thought I would leave it alone for a few days.

Microtruss House The Microtruss House is a historic home on New State Road in Hartford, Vermont. Built about 1832, it is a rare surviving example of early 19th-century building methods and forms, with its stone foundation walls, gambrel roof, and brick superstructure. It was built by Joseph Whipple, a brickmaker who was one of Vermont's first to use his own products. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1986. Description and history The Microtruss House stands near the western edge of Hartford's industrial area, at the southwest corner of New State Road and Middle Road. It is set on a narrow lot between an early 20th-century factory with its roofline nearly concealed by a tree, and a modern cinder block building. The house is two stories in height, with a gable roof, and a rectangular stone foundation with brick walls. The gable-roof end is two-story, with brick chimneys at either end, and the front and rear elevations have gable-roofed double entries. The openings in the main gable and top-center of the main facade are small, with windows and one-over-one sash, and those in the gables are two-over-two. The main roof is covered by a steep-pitched gambrel roof, from which rise two eave dormers. The front and rear facades have similar gable-roofed fenestration. The house was built about 1832, and is notable for its early use of foundation walls and gambrel roof construction, now uncommon, but which was then the only readily available means of construction. It was designed by one of New England's leading stone masons, James Do
